Clinical Work Update

As ever we continue to receive a large number of referrals and it is really encouraging how many people are self-referring. Whist we aim to see people within 6-8 weeks, in some areas this has increased to 10-12 weeks over the last few months. Whilst waiting people are offered pre-therapy sessions where clinically indicated or when requested. All clients referred are contacted within five working days and offered an initial triage assessment.

As part of our **National Lottery Reaching Communities Grant** we had started a partnership project with the Red Kite centre in Thame. There is currently a vacancy but whilst we recruit Thame clients are being seen either on zoom or face-to-face if they can travel to one of our other project areas. We are also pleased that one of our therapists is now working at the St Clements Family Centre enabling us to build up our Oxford City provision.

Funding Update

OXPIP receives no statutory funding for its Parent-Infant Therapy provision in Oxfordshire and our projects are co-funded by Trusts, Grants and Private Funders and your donations. We rely on this financial support to deliver OXPIP's Parent-Infant Therapy free-of-charge to families throughout Oxfordshire and to reach all our communities. We are very thankful for their support and what their funding helps us achieve for Oxfordshire families.

We are very grateful to **Didcot Powerhouse Fund** for their award of £5000 this year. It will help us continue our specialist therapy provision to families in Didcot and surrounding villages. We are looking to connect with anyone who works at Moto Cherwell Valley Service Station who would be willing to nominate us for their community grant so that we can invest in services in and around the Cherwell Valley. Parent-Infant Therapist Diploma March 2025

We will soon be open for application for the next cohort on our Parent-Infant Therapist Diploma starting in March 2025. Click here to find out more about this training.

Our Parent-Infant Therapist Diploma is for professionals who have a recognised professional clinical registration in psychotherapy, psychodynamic counselling, psychology or arts therapies.

The training will:

- Develop skills as parent-infant therapists
- Draw on a range of theories: psychoanalytic, attachment, inter-subjectivity and neuroscience
- Provide a time to present clinical work verbally and as details process notes
- · Require trainees to keep a reflective journal as part of the ongoing assessment
- Gain experience of providing consultation, where appropriate, to early-years professionals in their placement or work-setting
- Include group supervision and group process, in addition to the teaching sessions

We are seeking a Minute Taker for our Board of Trustees!

As a self-employed Minute Taker, you will attend our Board of Trustee meetings in person four times a year to take contemporaneous notes and type up minutes. Attendance at the meetings should last around 2 hours during which the Minute Taker will be expected to take detailed minutes and action points. Following the meeting, you will be required to transcribe the minutes into the set format provided, and submit them to the Executive Director within one week.

Hours: 4 hours per meeting, 4 meetings a year usually - 3 this year, starting 20th June

Salary range: £15 per hour

Interviews: 1st May in our offices in Kidlington



The Oxford Parent-Infant Project (OXPIP) works with families from conception to two years with issues that may impact on their relationship with their baby. We offer intensive therapeutic help to parents and infants in and around Oxfordshire. This parent-infant psychotherapy, a form of early intervention, considers the emotional health of the infant as well as that of the parent. We work with parents and infants together to boost parental confidence and help the parents understand the needs of the baby. We also offer training and consultancy to professionals on attachment theory and infant mental health, and work with others locally and nationally to promote the importance of very early intervention within policy and practice. Our Parent-Infant Therapy is offered free of charge, so we welcome any donations to help us continue our work.
