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#### Clinical Work Update

It has been a good year for OXPIP, having expanded our services in Thame, based at The Red Kite Centre, as part of the Reaching Communities NLCF Funding. It is so important to be based in the community and working in partnership with some of the family centres. The demand for our work continues to increase, but we are managing to keep the wait-list to mainly under 8 weeks, offering both face-to-face work across Oxfordshire and Zoom sessions too.

Please note that the OXPIP Office will be closed from Thursday 21st December, and will reopen on Tuesday 2nd January 2024. We will not be accepting referrals between 18th December and 1st January. ### **Funding Update**

OXPIP receives no statutory funding for its Parent-Infant Therapy provision in Oxfordshire and our projects are co-funded by Trusts, Grants and Private Funders and your donations. We rely on this financial support to deliver OXPIP's Parent-Infant Therapy free-of-charge to families throughout Oxfordshire and to reach all our communities. We are very thankful for their support and what their funding helps us achieve for Oxfordshire families.

The funding reality is that due to the current economic crisis, funders now receive multiple funding requests from hundreds of charities and worthy causes. Sadly, they have limited financial resources to help funding applicants and this has led to restricted funding availability with some funding streams no longer available to us. 

#### Celebrating 25 years of Parent-Infant Therapy Provision in Oxfordshire 1998 - 2023

The Oxford Parent-Infant Project (OXPIP) works with families from conception to two years with issues that may impact on their relationship with their baby. We offer intensive therapeutic help to parents and infants in and around Oxfordshire. This parent-infant psychotherapy, a form of early intervention, considers the emotional health of the infant as well as that of the parent. We work with parents and infants together to boost parental confidence and help the parents understand the needs of the baby. We also offer training and consultancy to professionals on attachment theory and infant mental health, and work with others locally and nationally to promote the importance of very early intervention within policy and practice. Our Parent-Infant Therapy is offered free of charge, so we welcome any donations to help us continue our work.



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
