

OXPIP Parent-Infant Therapist

Job Description

As an OXPIP Parent-Infant Therapist, you will provide parent-infant therapy for parents and babies under the age of two. You will work as part of the OXPIP clinical team and participate in weekly meetings. You will need to liaise with other professionals and may also be asked to deliver training and presentations to internal and external stakeholders.

Parent-Infant Therapists work as part of the OXPIP Team and participate in weekly team meetings on a Wednesday.

Main Purpose of the Role:	To provide individual and group-based parent-infant therapy for parents and babies from conception to two years of age. To provide consultation and training to health/social care professionals and other staff.

<p>Main Activities:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Weekly parent-infant therapy sessions which will include both individual dyadic/ triadic work and group work • Maintaining clinical records • Using case management system • Liaison and consultation with professional colleagues both within and outside of OXPIP • Ensuring safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults • Promoting OXPIP, and the awareness of parent infant mental health • Attending regular supervision • Attending clinical meetings and other OXPIP meetings and events as required • Delivering training and awareness raising sessions as required • Reporting to the CEO, Clinical Director • Ensuring the organisation continually operates within relevant legal requirements, including the Data Protection Act and Health and Safety Regulations • Other duties in line with the job purpose
